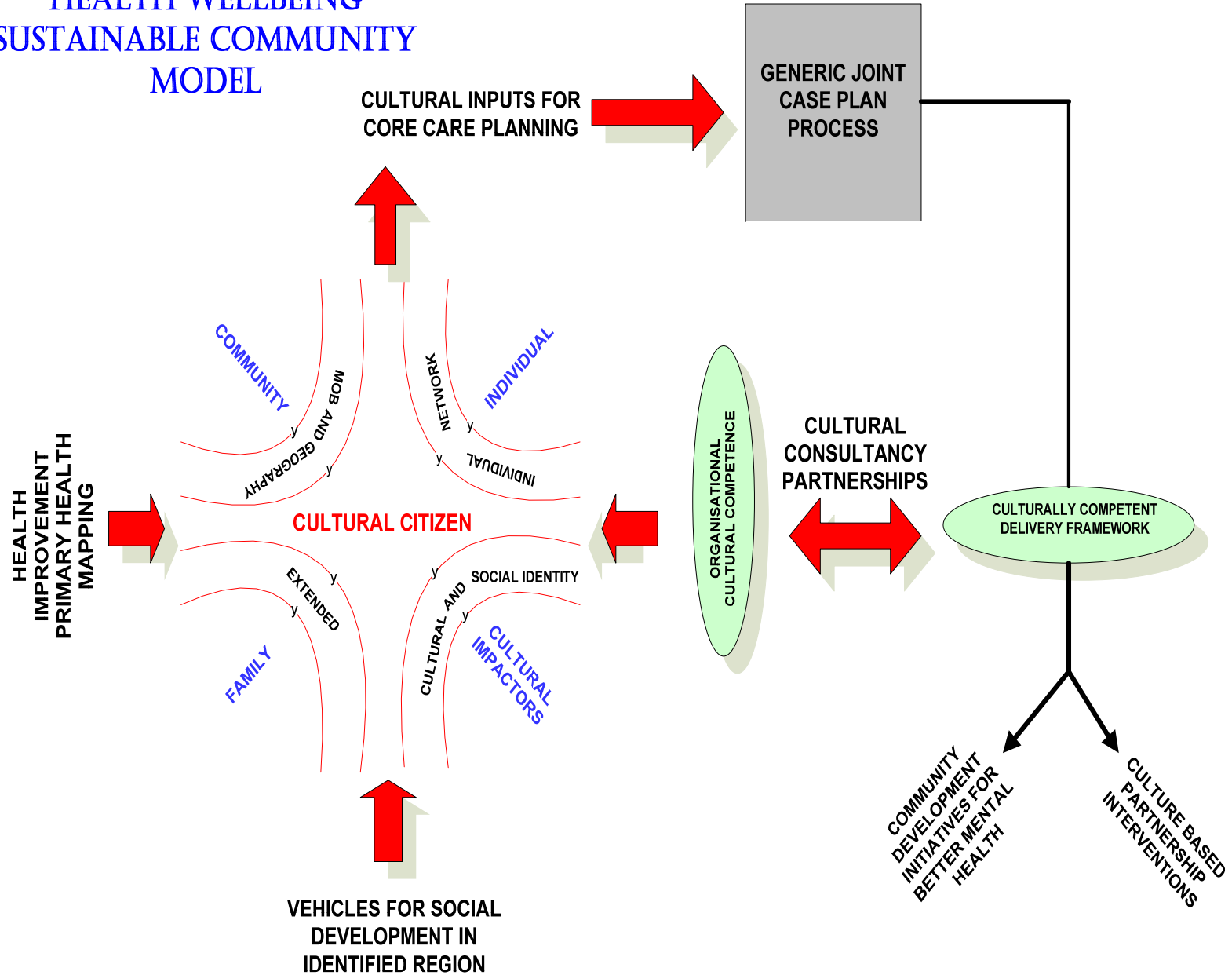

# IMPLICATIONS FOR GOOD PARTNERSHIP

## SERVICE PARTNERS NEED:

- Corporate flexibility
- Joint problem solving capacity
- Joint risk profiling and management
- Lateral conceptual capacity
- Clear agency contact points
- Shared language
- Timely planning processes

# IMPLICATIONS FOR PARTNERSHIPS WITH INDIGENOUS CONSUMERS

## PROMINENT ELEMENTS REQUIRED:

- Agency cultural competency
- Use of Cultural Consultancy
- Regional community development
- Broad service context – social and cultural networks
